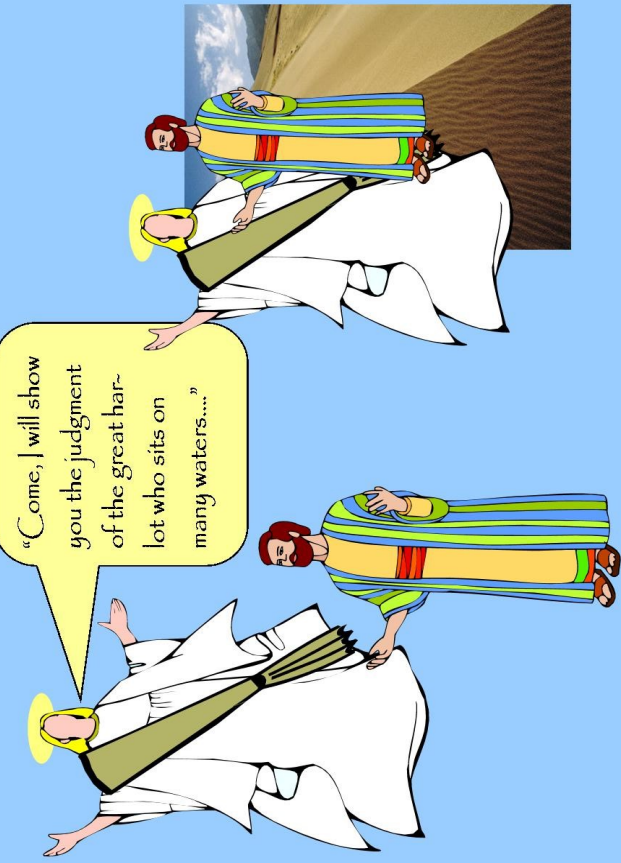

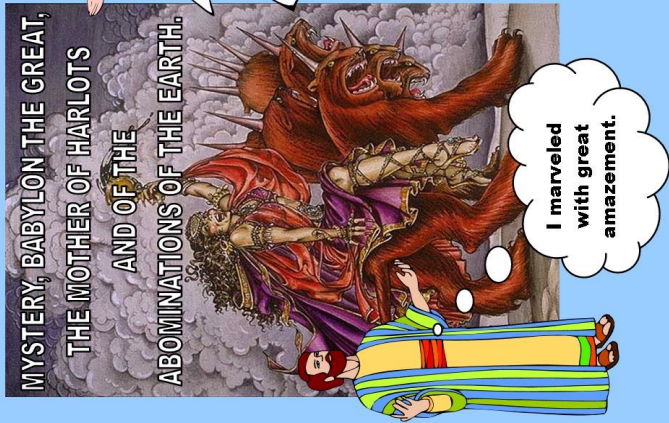

# Revelation 17

## CHAPTER SUMMARY

- One of angels with 7 last judgments shows John **“judgment of the great harlot” - Clues to identity:**
  - Sits on “many waters;” **Angel interprets:** waters = peoples, multitudes, nations, tongues.
  - Kings of earth “committed fornication”/her
  - *“Inhabitants of earth were made drunk with the wine of her fornication”*
  - Sits on scarlet beast (beast full of names of blasphemy, had 7 heads, 10 horns—Antichrist)
  - Wears purple and scarlet, adorned with gold and precious stones and pearls
  - Has golden cup in hand, full of abominations, and filthiness of her fornication
  - Name **“Mystery Babylon** the Great, Mother of Harlots and of the Abominations of the Earth.”
  - Drunk with blood of saints, martyrs of Jesus.
- **John stunned!** Can’t believe this. Angel asked John why he “marvels.” Will tell him the mystery. Tells John beast was, is not, and will ascend out of bottomless pit and go to perdition. Inhabitants of earth (*those whose names are not written in the Book of Life*) will marvel.
- **Spiritual wisdom** required here: *“seven heads are seven mountains on which the woman sits.”*
- Also **7 kings, 5 have fallen, one is, and the other has not yet come** (at time John is seeing this, not in timeline of book!). *“When he comes, he must continue a short time.” etc.)*
- Beast is **“eighth and is of the seven...” 10 horns = 10 kings**, not yet come in John’s time, will receive authority “for one hour” as kings with the beast. But will voluntarily give power to Antichrist, the beast, or the “eighth.”
- Will make war with the Lamb, **but Lamb will overcome them**, “for He is Lord of lords, and King of kings” and saints with Him are called chosen and faithful.
- 10 horns will hate harlot, make her desolate, naked, eat her flesh and burn her with fire. Will give their kingdom to the beast.
- Woman = **“that great city which reigns over the kings of the earth.”** (*only one answer —at that time Rome!*)

# Revelation 18

Babylon the Great is fallen!

## CHAPTER SUMMARY

- Another angel, with great authority cried "**Babylon the great is fallen, is fallen**, and has become a dwelling place of demons, a prison for every foul spirit, and a cage for every unclean and hated bird!"
- **Merchants** of the earth have become rich through the abundance of her luxury (*wealth, materialism*).
- Another voice "**Come out her, my people**, lest you share in her sins, and lest you receive of her plagues."
- Her sins have "reached to heaven, and God has remembered her iniquities."
- **Repay her double!** As much as she lived luxuriously, in same measure give her torment and sorrow.
- She said "I sit as queen, and am no widow, and will not see sorrow." "Therefore" her sudden fall will come in one day, death and mourning and famine. She will be utterly burned with fire.
- **Kings of earth** (*governments*) committed fornication/lived luxuriously/her, will weep and lament for her.
- **Merchants of the earth** also weep and mourn, no one buys their merchandise (commerce) Follows long list of goods, 28 cargoes, include items from mineral, plant, animal and HUMAN kingdoms (slave trades, souls of men).
- **Every shipmaster** (3rd group, global shipping) cried out, wept, mourned, alas, alas..."..all ships on the sea became rich by her wealth!"
- "**Rejoice over her**,... God has avenged you...!"
- **Mighty angel took millstone, threw it in sea** saying "Thus with violence the great city Babylon shall be thrown down, and shall not be found anymore..."
- No more music, workers, daily activities, no light, *no activity* ever again.
- **Reason?** "For your merchants were the great men of the earth, for by your sorcery all the nations were deceived. And in her was found the blood of prophets and saints, and of all who were slain on the earth." (*World's idea of "great men" = "merchants" - world's values all about money.*)

## FOLLOW-UP

1. **READ 2 Peter 2:4-10**, with particular attention on 2 Peter 2:4 (*PS—There's a special blessing in 2 Peter 4:9!*) The word for "hell" in this verse is "tartaroo" a word found only in this verse. It is not *Sheol, Hades, or Gehenna* (other words we translate as "hell"). It is understood to be the place of eternal confinement for fallen angels as well as the most wicked. How might this relate to the abyss of Revelation 20:1-3?
2. **READ Isaiah 24** (yes, all of it!). This is a very graphic and clear description of the days just prior to the event described in Revelation 20:1-3. Look especially at Isaiah 24:21-22. How is this relevant to Revelation 20:1-3?
3. **READ** the following scripture passages and relate each one to Revelation 20:4-6.

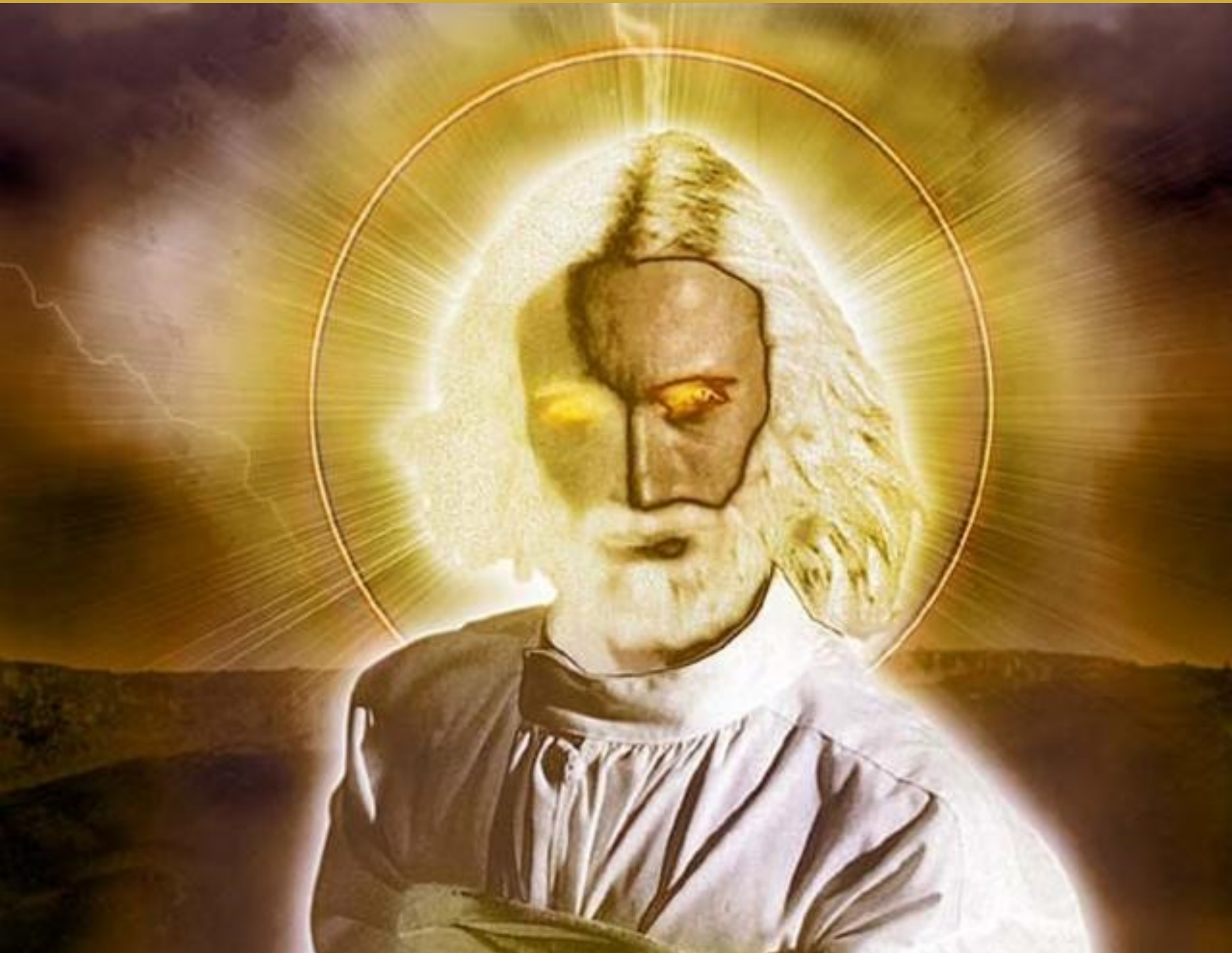
